BAF Scholarship Winners

As part of the Bay Alumni Foundtion's mission, this was the third year for the Scholarship Program. This year, three scholarships of \$500/each were given to two females and one male at the Kiwanis Academic Awards Night held in May in the Bay High Auditorium. All Bay Seniors are eligible to participate. We do not have a GPA requirement, however the student must be in good standing with the school. Students are required to write a creative essay which includes their memories at Bay High and provide fundraising ideas where the Foundation can synergize with the current student body.

It was another successful scholarship year. The essays were judged anonymously and the 2014 winners of the scholarships were Colleen Kowalski, Shaley Stearns and Robert Ziebarth. The funding for the scholarship awards are written directly to their school of choice which is applied towards tuition. Colleen is attending Case Western and pursuing nursing. Shaley is attending Kent State and and also pursuing nursing. Robert is going to pursue an engineering degree in the honors program at The Ohio State University.

Many essays were written and we read a lot of memories at Bay High, happy and sad. Colleen wrote memories that included throwing baby powder which created a massive white cloud drifting across the football field. Robert recalls the chills of marching down Main Street USA at Walt Disney. Shaley reminded us of three deaths this graduating class had endured over their school years. Where Are They Now and Who's Doing What?

A Series of Interviews with Alumni: Featured Alumni: Coach Al Nelson

What year did you graduate from BHS?

I graduated from BHS in '62. I had a great summer hanging out with friends Chic Kennedy, Rick Gaches, Bert Maheu, Dave Batley, Phil Rowell and Dick Maben.

Did you attend college and if so, where and what degree?

Off to Bowling Green State University. In the fall all of us high school buddies visited each of our respective colleges. The best of times! I interrupted my college "career" by enlisting in the Naval Reserves for two years. I returned to BGSU to finish with an BS in Education degree (Health and Physical Education K-12). After graduating I married my wonderful wife, Lynne and bought a house in Bay Village. We had two great kids Mark and Kari, both are Bay High School grads.

What type of jobs did you hold after graduating from BHS/college?

After BG I went to work for Sears Roebuck in their management program for a year at midway mall in Elyria. Then went to work for Gillette for six months before taking a teaching job in Bay Village at the middle school.

What did you teach/coach during your career?

I spent a wonderful 32 years teaching primarily health and some physical education at Bay Middle School. I immediately spent 4-1/2 years getting my masters at Cleveland State while coaching 8th grade boys basketball and JV boys baseball while raising a family. The 5th Bi-Annual Bay High Athletic Hall of Fame Induction Weekend will take place on Friday and Saturday, September 5 and 6. The Hall of Fame banquet will honor past Rocket athletes, coaches, teams and contributors who made their legacy while at Bay High. There will be a brief ceremony presenting the inductees to the community during the Bay/Westlake football game on Friday evening to recognize this year's inductees followed by an informal get together after the game at the Bay Lodge on Bradley Road. There is no cost for the after game reception and everyone is welcome inductees, alumni, family and friends. Beverages and light appetizers will be served.

On Saturday, September 6, the formal induction ceremony will be held at Wagner's in Westlake. The 1940-41 Boys Basketball Team who won the West County Conference Championship and were the only undefeated team in Cuyahoga County during the regular season and were coached by long-time teacher/coach John Shollenberger.

The 1971-72 Wrestling Team who won the first state championship in the history of Bay High School and produced two individual state champions with Jeff Schoeneman and Mark Totten.

Denny White, BHS Class of 1960 who earned 12 varsity letters at Bay High and who played in the East/West All-Star Football Game in 1960.

Jack Rekstis, BHS Class of 1963 who was All-Conference in football and track and held the school record in the 220 and 440 yard dashes and is a founding member of the BHS Athletic Hall of Fame.

Wayne Gray, BHS Head Track Coach from 1968-1979 and Assistant Football Coach from 1968-1975 and coached the Rockets to 9 consecutive SWC and Sectional Track Titles and 2 SWC Football Titles.

Bay Village History

Bay Village Yacht Club a.k.a. Bay Boat Club

In Bay Village, Lake Erie is our backyard playground. Hobo, Loafer, Restless and Bum. These names don't usually find their way into a sailing story, but add to them Vagabond, Wanderer, Tramp and Roamer and attach them to eight homemade sailing dinghies, and you have the nucleus of the Bay Village Yacht Club, the youngest yachting organization in the area in 1940.

The Biloxi dinghies were owned by Bay High School boys, Smith, Hruby, Sims, Asher, Sutliff, Miller, Nyerges and Brueggemann. The boys ranged in age from 13 to 18 years old. All the boats were homemade either by the boys and their parents or Henry Wischmeyer. Henry was the caretaker of the old Wischmeyer Hotel on Lake Road. At times he needed workers to pick peaches and strong backs to cut down and haul away trees and brush. He would hire high school boys who lived on the streets near the hotel to do chores around his property, and they became friends. Henry's boat house, no longer in use, was offered to the boys as a yacht club to store their boats and equipment. Almost every day

World War II began the breakup of the sailing fleet as seven members joined the Navy, four on the same day. When the war ended, and the boys came home, they found they had different interests and the club disbanded. The one thing that stayed constant was the lake which still pleasures us today.
