Distinguished Alumni Award

ELIGIBILITY

To be considered for the award, the person must:

- Have graduated from Bay High School, from the 12th grade at least 25 years prior to nomination
- Have been active and be distinguished in their chosen business, profession or life work, and have received some previous recognition from contemporaries
- Be a person of such integrity and stature that the school district or Alumni Foundation will take pride in his/her recognition
- Have participated in leadership roles within their community, and have demonstrated a concern for community relations

Funding our Future

The **Bay Village Education Foundation (BVEF)** is pleased to announce the grants that we have awarded in the Bay Village public schools for the 2008-2009 school year! This year we awarded more than \$8,000 towards educational projects in the schools. Congratulations to teachers, staff and students that submitted applications. Below are the projects that were awarded either full or partial funding this year.

Normandy Elementary School

- **Cooperative Play for First Graders:** Provides active, non-competitive activities during lunch recess that will promote and practice social skills, partner play and communication skills. *Golden Award Winner for projects that help special needs students succeed.*

Westerly School:

- **The Totally Ginormously Awesome LEGO Olympiad (student application):** Enhancement of the hugely successful LEGO Club/LEGO Olympiad program, which incorporates scientific process, math strategies and problem solving experiences through LEGOs. (LEGO Olympiad initially funded by BVEF in 2006).

Bay Middle School:

- **7th Grade Collaborative Team Building:** Year-long team building initiative to help 7th grade students develop a sense of belonging and social responsibility through regular activities, including educational games.

- **Mimio Boards for the Foreign Language Classroom:** Adds interactive technology into the foreign language curriculum thus creating a more engaging classroom experience, positively impacting over 500 students per year.

- **Mixed Media Presentations with the BMS Mobile:** Student teams create and perform live presentations incorporating music, creative writing/poetry and performance art with the mobile technology. *Waldron Award Winner for Excellence in English.*

Bay High and Bay Middle Schools:

- **Live Wires – Strings for the Future:** Creates new opportunities for students to learn to play electric string instruments in the BMS and BHS strings programs by providing funds for an electric viola, cello and violin. The Silent Viola was awarded in the memory of past Trustee Ken Hook.

- **PAL (Pupil Assistance in Learning):** PAL links students with disabilities with volunteer general education mentors who serve as role models and friends, help build self-esteem, promote learning and enable social, cultural and emotional growth.

- **Stock Market Investing:** Utilizing grant money to purchase actual stocks, students are provided with a real world opportunity to invest in the stock market. Students at BHS and BMS paired up to invest the grant money with the goal to learn about the stock market as well as help increase funds available to earn income for BVEF to distribute toward future grants. Funded by the Joseph H. Thompson Foundation. *Thompson Economics Education Award Winner.*

The following grant was funded by Bay Village Kiwanis through their partnership with the Bay Village Education Foundation. Special thanks to the Kiwanis for funding this program:

- **Normandy Exercise Trail:** Completion of a 1/2 mile exercise/walking trail for Normandy students in physical education classes. Helps students establish and maintain health enhancing levels of physical fitness. Trail will be available to the general community for exercise as well.

These exciting educational experiences were made possible due to donations from our community members. Bay Village Education Foundation is a non-profit organization that strives to enhance the learning opportunities available to Bay Village public school students. BVEF awards thousands of dollars in grant monies, scholarships and awards each year to support creative, innovative and motivational projects and programs not otherwise funded by tax dollars. We work closely with the board office, schools and teachers. BVEF has been funding educational projects since 1986.

BVEF held its third annual Fall Fundraising event titled “Creating Opportunities” early in October. Thank you to all who attended and supported this fun event – it was an even bigger success than last year, raising over \$12,000! Funds from this event will benefit **the children in our community** through increased grant money for projects in the Bay Village public schools.

Because the Dinner is held in just the even numbered years, our next Reunion will be on the last Saturday of September in 2010.


Girls of 1952 Celebration Luncheon

- Have demonstrated, through word or deed, the importance of their education in the Bay Village public schools

Once an Alumnus has been nominated, they will not be dropped from consideration for five years, provided they remain eligible according to the guidelines above, and have not been selected during that period.

NOMINATION PROCESS

Any individual who meets the following criteria may nominate former students for the award:

- Any member of the Alumni Foundation or its Board of Trustees
- Any member of the school district staff, current or retired
- Any graduate of Bay High School

A nomination must be supported by two other individuals, not related to the family of the nominee, whose contact information should be included with the nomination.

The selection committee will convene annually and select the inductees in May for that year's presentation. The inductees will be notified by June 1, and confirmation is needed within 30 days that they will be able to attend the award ceremony in person.
