### Bay Alumni Foundation Activities

#### Home for the Rockets: Alumni Class Challenge

The fundraising effort associated with "Home For The Rockets" is in full swing and we hope our collective alumni can do our part.

- **What is Home For The Rockets?** The construction of a new building at the south end of the high school stadium that will have home/visitor team rooms, a large concession stand, large restrooms, a Rocket spirit store and storage. - **Why do we need a new building?** The original plans for Bay Memorial Stadium called for a building to house the teams before games and at halftime, and for a larger central concession stand. There is only one restroom on the home side and it is small. The new building will have large restrooms that are centrally located and ADA compliant, a beautiful courtyard and a large concession stand and spirit store.

### Bay History

#### Homecoming Parade 25 Years and Growing!

The Bay Village Homecoming Parade is a fantastic city event that stretches from Cahoon to the high school. These days, it is typical to see the crowd four-to-five deep in areas from Glenview to the stadium and packed for the rest of the route. Like the Bay Memorial Day Parade, the Homecoming Parade draws participation from all kinds of groups. With the fire and police departments leading the way, there are also several floats from the Bay Alumni Foundation, which will hold alumni from the 1940s to present day. A few Bay classes hold their reunions on Homecoming weekend and participate in the parade. The phenomenal Bay High marching band, student council, class officers, scout troops, youth groups, homecoming court, and sports teams participate. This year also featured the Bay Alumni Foundation's newest inductees into the Distinguished Alumni and Distinguished Educator Hall of Fame.

The parade celebrates 25 years in 2019! As it has been said many times, out of challenge and controversy, people often come together for the good of all. This is, to some degree, the story behind the founding of the parade. In 1992, Bay Village experienced an extremely rare and short-lived teacher strike that lasted a few weeks, and in 1994, when it was time for a

## Fall Sports

This past fall, Bay High School Athletics excelled on the playing field and court. Girls Cross Country, Boys Cross Country and Boys Soccer were crowned Great Lakes Conference Champions. For Boys Cross Country and Boys Soccer it was their 4<sup>th</sup> conference title in five seasons. Girls Cross Country was led by Scott Snyder, Boys Cross Country was led by Steve Babson (Bay Alumnus), and Boys Soccer was led by Bobby Dougherty. All three coaches earned Great Lakes Conference “Coach of the Year” honors.

For Girls Soccer, Senior goalie Gigi Merk, earned Second-Team All-Ohio honors.

Volleyball was crowned O.H.S.A.A. Division 2 District Runner-up losing in a hard fought match, 3–1, to Holy Name (former state champion).

Football finished their season at 7–4 qualifying for the O.H.S.A.A. Playoffs in Division 3 for the 6<sup>th</sup> year in a row. Bay was only one of 28 schools in the state of Ohio that had made it to the playoffs for 6 years in a row or longer. Football was coached by Bay Alumnus, Ron Rutt.

Girls Cross Country was crowned O.H.S.A.A. District Runner-up honors qualifying them for Regionals. Members of the team who qualified for Regionals were Lexie Bechtel (sophomore), Olivia Bird (junior), Norah Hamil (sophomore), Annie Lang (senior), Ava Ransom (senior), Molly Rogers (freshman), and Phoebe Sutherland (freshman).

Boys Soccer was crowned O.H.S.A.A. District Champions in Division 2 for the 6<sup>th</sup> year in a row. They lost on penalty kicks in the Regional Semifinals to Lexington. Senior Kyle Cusimano was named Ohio’s “Mr. Soccer”, given to the top soccer player in the state of Ohio for all divisions along with earning Division 2 “Player of the Year”, and First Team All-Ohio honors. In addition, Senior Aidan Bozak earned First Team All-Ohio honors. Jeff Linhart (Bay Alumnus) was named “Assistant Coach of the Year” and Bobby Dougherty was named “Head Coach of the Year” for the state of Ohio in Division 2.

Boys Cross Country was crowned O.H.S.A.A. District and Regional Runner-ups. In addition, the team qualified for the O.H.S.A.A. State Championships and placed 4<sup>th</sup> for the second year in a row. Athletes representing the team in the State Meet were Jude Ault (junior), Kenzie Deibel (senior), Jacob Feicks (sophomore), Khaled Hamil (senior), Luke Hansen (sophomore), Michael Muccio (sophomore), and Will Warren (junior). In addition, Khaled Hamil and Will Warren earned All-Ohio honors by placing 14<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> overall.

## Fall/Winter Music Program

The music program had a busy fall semester and many concerts for winter/spring scheduled.

The Marching band camp began the last week of July, followed by the annual Bay Music Boosters fall membership drive. The drive raised more than \$ 35,000 thanks to the fantastic support of the entire Bay Village community. The Bay Rocket Marching Band with 184-members performed four different shows, including a show featuring the music of John Williams and a show full of disco music. The band participated

in the North Royalton Band Festival, which featured a performance of *America the Beautiful* performed by all of the bands together. On November 4, the band played all of this season’s music at the 42<sup>nd</sup> annual Varsity Concert. Proceeds from the Varsity Concert will go toward the purchase of a new instrument trailer for the marching band, which the Bay Music Boosters hope to purchase by next fall. The trailer is used to transport marching band instruments and equipment to away games and other offsite performances.

The Bay Orchestra was featured at the Day for Strings on October 30. All of the district’s string students, from fourth grade through high school, had the opportunity to work with Dr. Stephen L. Gage, Professor of Conducting and Director of Bands at Youngstown State University. The day culminated in a concert that ended with more than 200 string students performing “Oklahoma” together on the stage.

- **Why are private donations required?** The cost is \$1.6 million dollars. A fair amount of the cost is sewer, water and gas connections. The school board will fund a portion of the building via tax dollars and hope the remainder can be raised by private donations.
- **Have funds already started coming in?** Nearly \$800,000 has been donated or committed.
- **How can alumni participate?** Soon you will receive information about The Alumni Class Challenge. We are asking each class to raise a specific amount of money to help this cause. We have set achievable goals for each class year, whereas based on the typical class size if only 100 classmates were to donate \$50 each, every class would exceed the goals that have been set. We know some people will donate more and we know some will not donate at all. We are asking all alumni to consider a tax deductible donation for this effort.
- **Is personal recognition available?** There will be the opportunity to be recognized (or to honor someone) at certain donation levels. This will all be outlined on the BAF website, the BAF Facebook site and in communication you should receive from your class representative.
- **Will the Bay Alumni Foundation be recognized?** Based on achieving our fund raising goal, Bay Alumni (not the foundation) will have strong representation in and around the building.

much needed school levy, the climate was less than favorable. Amy Fritz Brill was the chair of the levy effort that would be on that fall's ballot. As a proud 1978 graduate (and cheerleader) from BHS, she knew she needed to rally the community in a positive and collective effort that would be open and appealing to everyone. "A homecoming parade might just be the thing we need right now," she thought. "A reminder of the positive aspects of a healthy community and school system that are the reasons many of us came to and stay in Bay."

A committee was formed with Amy as chairperson, and included volunteers from the community (Lois Huffman, Linda & Jim Erickson, Dee Woodbery, Pete Winzig, Joy Corbit, Tom Hitchcock, Amy Huntley, Susan Fain, Linda Karl, Jayne Cohn, Gerry Horning, Carol Shockley, Mary Morris, Rosemarie Crudele, Andi Dickman, George Massey, and Rob Grady), the school board (Nancy Rodgers, Carol Pancoast, Larry Elmore, Cathy Gilchrist, and Karen Lieske), teachers (Chuck Millheim, Paul Lehman, Ruth Purdy, Tony Frasier, David Frost and Pete Hussey), as well as administration officials (Superintendent Randy Stortz, Treasurer John Cavalier, Public Relations Officer Barb Doidge, and Debbie Putnam). Bay High principal Joe Loomis and Bay Middle School Principal Dave Wilson rounded out the committee. Linda Karl headed up the efforts around the parade, a "one-time" event.

Cleveland before a performance of *A Christmas Carol*. The Choir will perform their holiday concert on December 12 and 15 which often sells out. In March, A Capella and Treble choirs will travel to Nashville to perform and attend a masterclass given by a choral professor at Belmont University. On March 10 they preview their Nashville repertoire during their Winter Choir Concert in the auditorium.

The Concert, Symphonic and Jazz holiday performance will be on December 19. The Concert and Symphonic bands will perform at contest in early March and will preview those performances in the auditorium on February 25.
