In television, Geoff has applied his talents to many shows across a wide range of genres- from Mob Wives (VH1) to Jesus: The Lost 40 Days and Roanoke: Search for the Lost Colony

(History) to The Circus (Showtime), and many others. More recently, Geoff has served as Co-Executive Producer and Supervising Editor on AMC's travel series Ride with Norman Reedus.

Gerald (Jerry) Smith Obituary

Our community recently lost a long-time supporter, influencer and advocate. Gerald (Jerry) Smith passed away in October at the age of 93. Jerry was one of the original owners of a home he helped design on Salem Drive. He was instrumental in saving the old gas lights from the streets of Cleveland and

installing them on Salem 60 years ago. While Jerry didn't graduate from Bay High, his children and stepchildren did (Jerry and Jeff Smith, Kim (Johnson Flash - '72') and Eric Johnson ('78'). Even though he was not a BHS grad, his commitment to Bay and Bay High School have left their mark. When the new "Junior High" (now the high school) was being built - there was a desire to build a new stadium at what would become Bay High School - and Bay Memorial Stadium. Jerry was asked to help lead the effort to raise funds, devise the plans and manage much of the construction. Jerry owned a construction company and used his own employees to disassemble the stands at the "old Parkview stadium" and transport them to the new stadium location. He wanted students excited and involved, so he requested a team of current BHS students to help assemble the stands in the new location. BAF Treasurer Bill Smith remembers this - as he was one of those students "drafted into this effort".

The Class of '71 was the last class that played at the old stadium. I had Metal shop with Mr. Myers which I was looking forward to as I always enjoyed Wood shop. Well the

first day of class Mr. Myers handed everyone metal filing brushes and sent us out back on a brisk day to scrape the rust off the old stadium stands which had been moved and sitting out behind the school for enough time to develop quite an amount of rust. We basically did this for the first month of shop class. Needless to say, we didn't look forward to Metal Shop that year.

Jerry also worked with his friend and neighbor, George Steinbrenner, to have all the materials for the new press box donated from one of the company's George owned. Jerry also had a vision for a "team building" on the north end of the field - nearly the same sort of design that is being planned for the south end of the field now - as part of the Rockets Renovation effort. Jerry had the new building all designed, the plumbing, gas and electric all planned - but then there was debate among school board members whether the building should be built - and it never was. Jerry left his mark in several other ways too - including time and funding for structures at Bradley Park, Play-In- Bay and elsewhere throughout our wonderful village. We are forever thankful for dedicated and generous citizens like Jerry.

Thanks to the CARES Act, there is a new "above-the-line" tax deduction available up to \$300 for individuals and \$600 for joint filers for anyone who takes the standard deduction on their tax return. This incentive is still in place for 2021, so make a gift today?



George Hill Obituary

It is with great sadness that we advise that George Hill, class of '52, has died. He was 87. George grew up in Bay and was a stand out football player for Coach Jack Llewellyn. His brother Tom, has been an active member of the Bay Alumni Foundation and always has wonderful stories of growing up in Bay Village. George was a proud Rocket and was inducted into the Alumni Foundation Distinguished Alumni Hall of Fame.

George had a long and successful career in football. He played football at Denison where he started his coaching career as the defensive coordinator. His college coaching career took him to Cornell and Duke before he went to Ohio State. He was the Ohio State defensive coordinator under Woody Hayes for eight years. He was considered to be Hayes's

likely replacement when the Ohio State staff was let go after the 1978 season.

His career shifted to the NFL where he was an assistant coach for the Philadelphia Eagles and Indianapolis Colts before joining the Miami Dolphins. He was the linebackers coach for the Dolphins under Don Shula. Don Shula brought Hill from Dallas to Miami. Hill was promoted to defensive coordinator when Jimmy Johnson became the Dolphins coach in 1996. The 1998 Dolphins defense ranked as the league's best. Hill oversaw Zach Thomas, who was named Rookie of the Year in 1996, and helped draft players such as Jason Taylor, Patrick Surtain and Sam Madison develop to Pro Bowl seasons.

Hill had a celebration of life ceremony Nov. 19 in Lake Placid, Florida. Sincere condolences to his family and friends.

Girls Cross Country and Boys Soccer were crowned Great Lakes Conference Champions. For the first time in GLC history, Girls Tennis was crowned Great Lakes Conference Champions. For Boys Soccer it was their fifth conference title in six seasons. Girls Cross Country was led by Scott Snyder, Boys Soccer was led by Bobby Dougherty, and Girls Tennis was led by Kristine Gambrell. All three coaches earned "GLC Coach of the Year" honors.

Girls Cross Country earned a trip to the O.H.S.A.A. Regional Meet by placing fourth at Districts. Members that competed in the District and Regional Meet were Abbie Dent (sophomore), Lexie

Bechtel (junior), Olivia Bird (senior), Molly Rodgers (sophomore), Phoebe Sutherland (sophomore), Maeve Ransom (sophomore), and Isabella Wyman (freshman).

Boys Soccer was crowned the O.H.S.A.A. District Champions in Division II for the 7th year in a row. They lost in the Regional Semifinals to Howland 1-0. Senior Matt DeCapua and Senior Nolan Sooy were named Second Team All-Ohio while Senior Brock Pickett was named First Team All-Ohio and Division II Player of the Year. Head Coach Bobby Dougherty was named Division II "Coach of the Year" for the state of Ohio.

Boys Cross Country earned their seventh trip in a row and their thirty-third overall trip to the O.H.S.A.A. State Meet. They also were District Runners-up and Regional Champions. The team earned a fourth place finish in

the State Meet. Members that competed in the State Meet were Jude Ault (senior), Will Warren (senior), Eza Fleeman (senior), Michael Muccio (sophomore), Luke Hansen (sophomore), Jacob Feicks (senior), Patrick Melvin (junior), and Will Dunston (freshman - alternate).
