# Dreams Really Do Come True

**Congratulations to Austin Carras, class of '12, tear down mechanic for Front Row Motorsports who had 3 cars in the Dayton 500.**



**A**ustin Carras, BHS Class of 2012, was not a typical high school senior. Instead of making plans to go to college or into the service after graduation, he had a very different goal.

In 2004, during a family vacation, he and his family visited the Daytona Motor Speedway for a guided tour of the stadium and track. The next year they went to the Daytona 500 in person and he knew he wanted to be involved in NASCAR.

After graduation, he packed a bag and drove his truck to North Carolina to follow his dream. Once he arrived in North Carolina, he attended the NASCAR Institute for 2 years where he also worked as an apprentice for a NASCAR Xfinity Team. Austin was hired as a tear down mechanic and pit crew member. He now works as a tear down mechanic for Front Row Motorsports who had 3 cars in the Dayton 500 on February 14, 2021. After a 17 car crash only 14 laps in, 2 of the 3 cars were

out of the race and the team's hope for a top-15 finish for at least one of their cars faded. But in one of the most stunning upsets in 500 history, Michael McDowell came from behind to win the race! Austin told Alex Kamczyc from the West Life, "It feels amazing. We're a smaller team going up against crews with multimillion-dollar cars, and we won. It was a team effort, and I'm happy to be part of it!"

## White House Christmas



**B**HS Grad, Susan Bell Hamilton, class of '73, was chosen as part of the team of volunteers who decorated The White House for Christmas 2020. Susan helped decorate the Blue Room, the Library, the Green Room, the West Wing and the East Wing.

She got the idea to apply after seeing a segment on "Good Morning America" in August. After a series of background checks and an interview, Susan was one of 80 designers selected out of 8000 applicants. Susan has an impressive resume – she studied art and English at Ohio University, then began working in flower shops and spent 30 years as an interior designer for Ethan Allen in Connecticut. After retiring from Ethan Allen, she is a private interior designer in Connecticut and Florida.

The look and theme of the decorations is a closely guarded secret and none of the volunteers are permitted to take any photos or share any information. Designers began at 6am and worked until 5pm for the 3 days it took to complete the transformation.

According to an article by Dan Swarz in the November 30, 2020 Washingtonian, "First

Lady Melania Trump chose an "America the Beautiful" theme for the family's final Christmas at the White House. The 2020 White House Christmas decorations came together over the Thanksgiving weekend thanks to help from more than 125 volunteers from around the country. This year's White House decorations follow a similar design template – clean topiary displays and bold color schemes. More than 1200 feet of garland, 3200 strands of lights, 17,000 bows, and 62 Christmas trees were used."







## Learn from the past, Envision the future, Live in the present

SAVE THE DATE! Homecoming 2021 is the weekend of September 24 and 25! And this year we honor new inductees into the Distinguished Alumni and Distinguished Educator Hall of Fame.

There are so many alums who have impacted the world since leaving the Bay schools – and their lives have touched so many people. Some have had amazing careers, some have started businesses, some have supported important causes or shared their time and talent to change their corner of the world. Honoring them is a privilege. Walking down the Hall of Fame hallway at the high and seeing those plaques with the likeness of each inductee and a description of their accomplishments is humbling.

Is there a teacher, administrator, coach, or

advisor who impacted your life? We were all lucky to be surrounded by so many talented and dedicated teachers in our years in the Bay schools. There is no better way to say thank you than to nominate them to the HOF.

The official criteria is:

The Alumni Hall of Fame Award was established in 1987 to honor those individuals who have realized great achievements and served their communities well in their years after graduating from the Bay Village public schools. To be considered for the award, the person must have graduated from Bay High School at least 25 years prior to the nomination.

The Distinguished Educator Award was established in 1991 to honor educators who were employed in the Bay school district for a minimum of 10 years and have been recognized by the community, staff, students and/or parents as being a positive role model and whose extraordinary efforts made an impact on students and staff. To be considered for

the award, the person must have been employed full-time a minimum of 10 years in the Bay Village public schools and have retired, resigned, or been reassigned at least 3 years before being considered for inclusion.

Each inductee is introduced to the students and staff at the Pep rally Friday afternoon, then ride in the homecoming parade, and are presented to the community between quarters of the football game. They are honored at a brunch Saturday morning where each will receive their plaque which will be on display in the Alumni Hall of Fame hall. Each will be introduced by their nominator and will share their story with all who attend. If you haven't seen the display outside the auditorium at the high school, take the time to look for it the next time you are at the high school – it's very impressive!

Senior Mason Cover qualified for the O.H.S.A.A. State Wrestling Tournament. Mason placed 8th earning All-Ohio honors. The Wrestling team was led by Ryan Cover.

Coach Cover completed his 12th and final year as the head coach as he has decided to devote his time to watching his sons wrestle in college. Coach Cover's teams won four conference championships, and finished Sectional Runner-up five times. Coach Cover compiled a 127-60 overall record and a 37-3 record in the Great Lakes Conference. He had four State Tournament placers and nine State Tournament qualifiers. The

Bay Athletic Department and Bay High School appreciate his time, effort, and dedication to the Wrestling program.

The Boys Basketball team, led by Jared Shetzer, was crowned Great Lakes Conference Champions. This was their third GLC Championship in six years. Ashton Price was named Great Lakes Conference Most Valuable Player.
