This past fall sports season was truly one for the ages.

Football: The football team qualified for the OHSAA Playoffs for the 11th year in a row, defeating Cloverleaf 41-14 in the first round. This victory marked their first playoff win since 2017. The team also retained the "Little Brown Jug" and reclaimed the "Helm" by defeating Westlake and Rocky River. Junior **Rocco Ereditario** earned Third Team All-Ohio recognition, while senior **Liam Albright** received Second Team All-Ohio honors. The team was led by Bay High alumnus **Ron Rutt**.

Volleyball: In the inaugural Cleveland West Conference season, the volleyball team was crowned **CWC Champions**, achieving back-to-back conference championships for the Lady Rockets. Head coach **Katie Seal** earned CWC Coach of the Year honors.

Boys Golf: The boys golf team were Sectional Champions and qualified for the OHSAA State Tournament for the first time since 1995, finishing 11th as a team. The team was coached by **Rick Manderine.**

Girls Cross Country: The girls cross country team had two runners qualify for the OHSAA State Meet: seniors **Brooklyn Marriott** and **Erin Belveal**, who finished 37th and 38th, respectively. The team was coached by **Scott Snyder**.

Boys Cross Country: The boys cross country team won the Cleveland West Conference Championship, with senior Michael Hanselman taking first place. Junior Kieran Ripley was crowned Regional Champion, the first since Michael Brajdic in 2010. The team qualified for the OHSAA State Meet for the 37th time, finishing 8th overall. Connor Spellman (12th) and Kieran Ripley (22nd) earned All-Ohio honors. Team members included Spencer Grace (senior), Michael Hanselman, Sacha Jones (junior), Liam Jager (freshman), Peyton Myers (senior), Kieran Ripley (junior), and Connor Spellman (senior). Alternates were Brennen Lyons (senior) and Stephen Murphy (junior). The team was coached by Bay High School alumnus Jack Hautz, who was also named CWC Coach of the Year.


Girls Soccer: The girls soccer team had a phenomenal season, culminating in a 1-0 victory over Medina Highland to win the **OHSAA State Championship**. This marked their first state title since 2003. The team also finished as Co-CWC Champions. Seniors **Emery Aschenbrener** and **Tessa Knapp** earned First Team All-Ohio honors. **Knapp** was further recognized as Division III Player of the Year, Ohio Ms. Soccer, US Soccer Coaches All-Region, and US Soccer Coaches All-American. The team was led by first-year coach **Scott Simpson**.

School Records: Several school records were broken this fall across all sports:

- Football: Senior Billy Willmitch set a new school record for most tackles in a season (130).
- Golf: Senior lan Williams broke records for the lowest 9-hole average (35.8) and 18-hole average (75.9). The boys
 golf team, including Jack Chalmers, Tommy Mack, Trevor Ormsby, Travis Ropelewski, Ben Shuster, and Ian
 Williams, recorded the lowest dual match score (146) against North Olmsted.
- Girls Soccer: Senior Emery Aschenbrener set records for most assists in a game (6), most assists in a season (27), and most assists in a career (67). Senior Tessa Knapp broke records for most goals in a season (64) and most points in a career (475). Knapp also set the state record for most career goals (212) by any Ohio high school athlete, male or female. The team set records for most wins in a season (22) and most shutouts in a season (17).
- Volleyball: Freshman Payton Masterson set the school record for highest serve reception percentage (95%). Junior Olivia Miller set records for most kills in a season (364) and highest kill percentage (49.5%). Sophomore Amelia Vecchio broke records for most aces in a match (14) and most consecutive serves (21). The team set a school record for the fewest points allowed in a match (10).

An excerpt of a memoir written in 2011 by Gayle Grossman Floyd, Class of 1961

(Bay Village schools: Forestview Elementary 1950-1956, Bay High School 1957-1961)

Looking back at the last 50 years of my life since high school, I realize how important the 11 years of schooling I had in Bay Village were to the rest of my life!

My earliest memories are of **Susie Kitchen** and me playing lots of kickball. **Bonnie Wright** and I played dolls. **Di Dyer** would stand outside the front window of our Oakland Rd. house and made faces at me while my mother forced me to practice the piano, one hour a day!

Getting to Forestview School from my house involved cutting through the woods behind the house of **Police Chief Eaton** and his wife, **Mrs. Eaton**, my kindergarten teacher. Can you imagine letting our kids cut through the woods today?

On to high school as a 7th grader where the building was huge. There were a lot of rules. Upper classmen were awesome. Remember the noontime movies in the auditorium? Remember the pep rallies? There was one year when a bunch of us girls who lived east of the high school walked home from school each day and timed it so we could see "The Dick Clark Show" on afternoon television. We patterned our dress and our likes of music to what those Philadelphia kids were doing. Our Bay Way dances were based on whatever we saw them doing. Didn't we take dance lessons in 7th grade at the Community House?

Then there was the influence of my teachers. In 8th grade, **Mrs. Mary Esherick** turned me on to American history. I read every biography I could find. It looks like the librarian, **Mrs. Margaret Kessler**, signed my yearbook. She must have been an early influence on me. I eventually became a K-6 teacher and, after I received my master's degree when I was 40 years old, I became an elementary librarian.

Curt Crews set such a high example of what music should be all about. Singing while standing in the first row of the Christmas tree structure was certainly a highlight of my high school years.

Yes, Bay Village and its school system certainly gave me a grounding for a good life!

A Unique Financial Opportunity that Includes a 'No Tax Increase' Levy

During its December 16, 2024, Regular Board Meeting, the Bay Village Board of Education received a recommendation from **Bay Village Schools Superintendent Scot Prebles** and **Treasurer Meghan Rohde** to place a Permanent Improvement Levy on the May of 2025 ballot. If approved, the new, no tax increase Permanent Improvement Levy will generate funds to pay for building improvements, technology, textbooks and transportation, with no increase in taxes for Bay Village residents.

The Board voted unanimously to approve the recommendation, which Bay Village residents will vote on at the May 6, 2025, primary election.

The goals of the Finance + Facilities of the Future Plan are to: 1) Decrease stress on the district's general fund to create long-term financial stability; 2) Push out the 2022 operating levy cycle until at least 2027; 3) Create annual capital investment sustainability; and 4) Generate funds to pay for Bay Village Schools' Finance + Facilities for the Future Plan.

The district also plans to pay off the 2012 Construction Bond early, saving approximately \$790,000 in interest payments.
