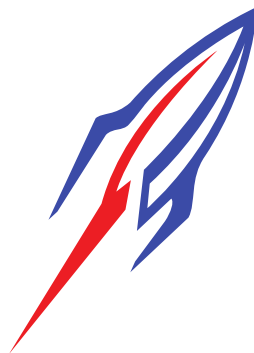

FISCAL YEAR 2025 IN REVIEW - MESSAGE FROM PRESIDENT

As I reflect on my first year serving as President, after being involved with the Bay Alumni Foundation for over 15 years, I am filled with gratitude and excitement for what lies ahead. I want to begin by thanking and recognizing our past leaders whose hard work and dedication built the strong foundation on which we continue to grow.

Our year began in July with our **Rocket Day Fundraiser**, held during the week of July 20th to honor the anniversary of the first moon landing. Just as a Rocket launched astronauts to the moon, this event launched us into one of our most successful fundraising efforts ever. The support we received from our alumni and friends exceeded all expectations and set a positive tone for the year.

In the fall, we gathered for **Homecoming**, where we continued our tradition of celebrating the pride and spirit of our alumni community. The homecoming parade went off without a hitch as we celebrated the 30th anniversary of traveling down Wolf Road from the middle school to the high school with many community organizations, sports teams, extracurricular activities and, of course, our fantastic high school marching band. Thanks to our many sponsors, the Alumni Foundation kept up its tradition of giving away frisbees, mini foam footballs, basketballs, soccer balls and candy.

Then in October, we were honored with the **largest single scholarship contribution/funding in our history**. Sue and John Benevento generously contributed \$50,000 to establish two \$2,500 scholarships. One scholarship will be earmarked for a student seeking to advance their education in the electrical/computer field and the second scholarship will be geared to a student seeking to further their education in the healthcare/health sciences arena. Their generosity is a gift that will help students for the foreseeable future.

In March, we held our **Alumni Madness Bowling Event**, bringing alumni together for a fun night socializing with old friends and meeting new ones. The proceeds directly supported our expanding scholarship program.

In May, our **Scholarship Committee awarded eight scholarships**, the most ever in a single year. These included the two inaugural Benevento Scholarships, one from the Class of '66, one from the Voiers fund and four additional \$1,000 scholarships funded by donations and Alumni Madness.

This year also marked a **very special moment for the Voiers family and our alumni community**. The Voiers restricted fund awarded its final scholarship in May, and with the closing of that chapter, the restricted fund will be used to fund a lasting tribute: the naming of the Bay High School basketball court as the "**Coach Rich Voiers Court**." Coach Voiers was one of the most successful coaches in Bay High history, and this dedication ensures that his legacy of leadership, excellence, and inspiration will live on for generations of students and

athletes. The Voiers restricted fund is still accepting donations to help fund the cost of the naming rights.

The end of May brought **Senior Field Day**. On their last day of school before commencement, the graduating seniors have Field Day. There are no classes that day, but they arrive late, have an awards assembly, a cookout lunch, and games in the afternoon. The students are asked to wear a shirt from the school or branch of service or job that will be the next leg of their journey.

The Bay Alumni Foundation and senior parent volunteers cook burgers and hot dogs with all the fixings, as well as provide chips and cookies. As President of BAF, I welcomed the newest graduating class to the Alumni Foundation. This year the Parents of the Class of 2025 split the cost with the Alumni Foundation.

During the year, we began the exciting process of selecting our new **Hall of Fame Inductees**. The Distinguished Alumni were Dik Daso '77, Sandi Blankner Gorman '69, Paul Hartranft '64 and Hank Unger '86. The Distinguished Educators were Dr. Maynard Bauer, Mike Kozlowski, Aurora Pinto and Chet Sadonick. The new class of inductees will be formally recognized at **Homecoming 2025** with a parade and luncheon.

As the year came to a close, we began the exciting process of updating our Hall of Fame and History Corridor. Phase 2 to update the corridor is now underway.

Looking back, I am proud of what we accomplished together in my first year. Looking forward, my commitment is to **strengthen alumni engagement**, expand our reach, and continue building on the remarkable momentum we have created. Thank you all for your ongoing support, generosity, and dedication. Together, we are shaping a bright future.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Overview

Our actual financial statements can be located on the Bay Alumni Foundation webpage at bayalumni.com/organizational/financials. The recap below tries to capture the major areas in an easier to understand format.

Revenue Results

We had our best revenue year **EVER** due to the largest unrestricted alumni donations ever, a very generous alumni donation from the Benevento Family to fund scholarships and a very good year on our return on investments.

Alumni Donations can be without or with restrictions. Donations without restrictions go to support the operating needs such as our activities (Homecoming, Senior Field Day), the Shoreline, and other operating expenses. Donations with purpose restrictions are for a specific purpose like scholarships, or other projects the Foundation takes on.

The Foundation also receives funds through events like Alumni Madness bowling, the Tailgate, in the past the Tri-Bay golf outing, and donations from sponsors to help with homecoming and other event activities.

We also receive an investment return on our funds invested at Cleveland Foundation.

Summary of Revenue

A summary of our Revenue funding for the last three years is shown below.

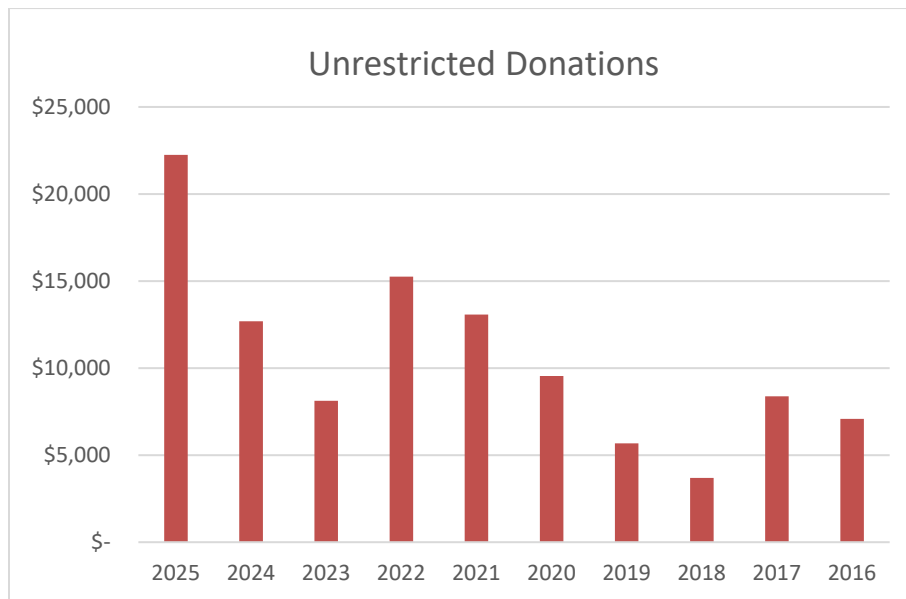
Alumni Contributions - Unrestricted

We had our largest alumni unrestricted revenue ever thanks to our Rocket Day fundraiser. We implemented a fund raiser through Facebook and other social media for the 10 days leading up to July 20, the day of the first moon landing to tie into our Rocket mascot. We utilized PayPal and Venmo QR codes to make it easier for alumni to donate.

It far exceeded our expectations by raising over \$9,300 which was over 3.5 times our largest revenue month ever and 10.5 times our average monthly revenue. Plus, it was in the first month of our fiscal year which makes it easier to budget our expenses and plan events for the balance of the year.

Our unrestricted alumni revenue was up over \$9,500 from the prior year and over \$14,000 from 2023. That's a 75% (2024) and 174% (2023) increase.

Alumni Contributions - Restricted

Alumni can donate funds that must be used “restricted” for a specific purpose. This includes scholarships and donations for “brick and mortar” projects that the Alumni Foundation takes on such as Hall of Fame Corridor, Field of Dreams, etc.

Scholarships:

Benevento Family Scholarship:

The largest single scholarship contribution/funding ever provided to the Bay Alumni Foundation for \$50,000 was received in 2025. This donation established a new scholarship fund, by 1985 married classmates John and Susan Kennedy Benevento. This scholarship will provide two annual \$2,500 scholarships for at least the next 10 years. The Benevento Family Fund Scholarship will award these annual scholarships to two graduating seniors who have shown exceptional success in academics, have given back through community service, and have exemplified school spirit. One scholarship will be earmarked for a student seeking to advance their education in the electrical/computer field and the second scholarship will be geared for a student seeking to further their education in the healthcare/health sciences arena.

Class of 1966 and BAF Restricted Scholarships:

Contributions of \$2,150 (Class of 1966) and \$2,795 (Other scholarships) were received in 2025.

Restricted Scholarship funds increased \$53,508 which was the net difference between donations of \$54,326 plus investment income earned of \$10,182 less \$11,000 of scholarships paid.

Voiers Fund:

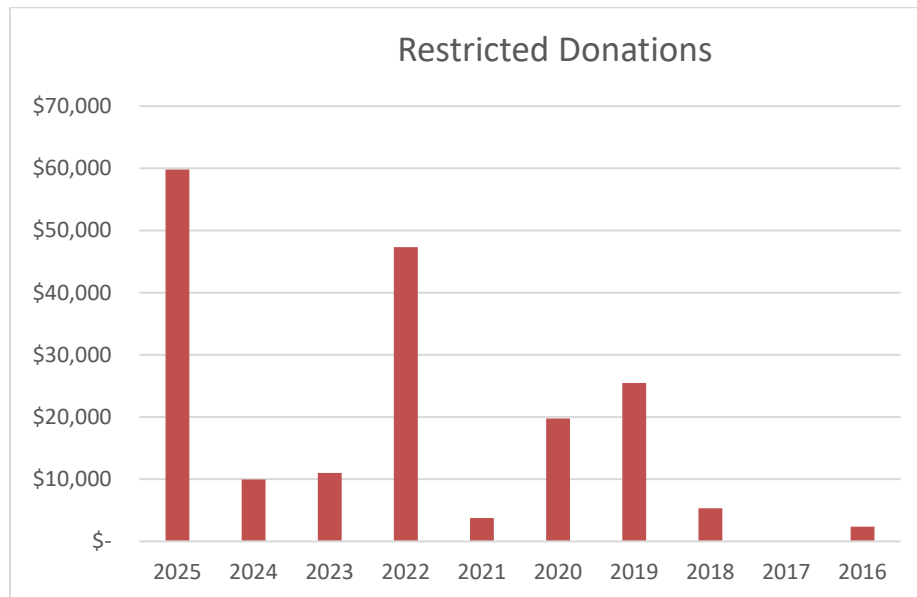
The Voiers fund paid their last \$1,000 scholarship out in 2025. The balance of the funds will be put towards the naming of the high school basketball court the "Coach Voiers Court". Donations of \$2,795 were received in 2025 from alumni to fund the cost of naming the court. The Voiers fund is actively recruiting for donations to cover the remaining naming rights cost.

Other "Brick and Motor" Restricted:

In 2022 we started running a successful campaign to reimagine the Hall of Fame corridor with memorabilia and displays as well as enhancing the web page related to the Hall of Fame. The Hall now shows the history of Bay High and has pictures of every graduating class. We have also upgraded the Hall of Fame inductees displays. We have had great support from alumni and have raised over \$52,000 to date. The initial stage of this project was finished in 2023 and looks spectacular. We have received many compliments from visitors and other school systems. We received \$860 of donations in 2025. We will keep accepting donations to fund the ongoing costs of maintaining the corridor and are starting phase 2 of the project in the coming year.

The Field of Dreams project which was run in conjunction with other Bay organizations started in 2019 and ended in 2021. We raised over \$25,000 from alumni towards the project.

Other Income – Sponsors, Special Events

Other income consists of sponsorships for homecoming and other events as well as special events. Income was \$2,325 (2025); \$2,959 (2024) and \$3,495 (2023).

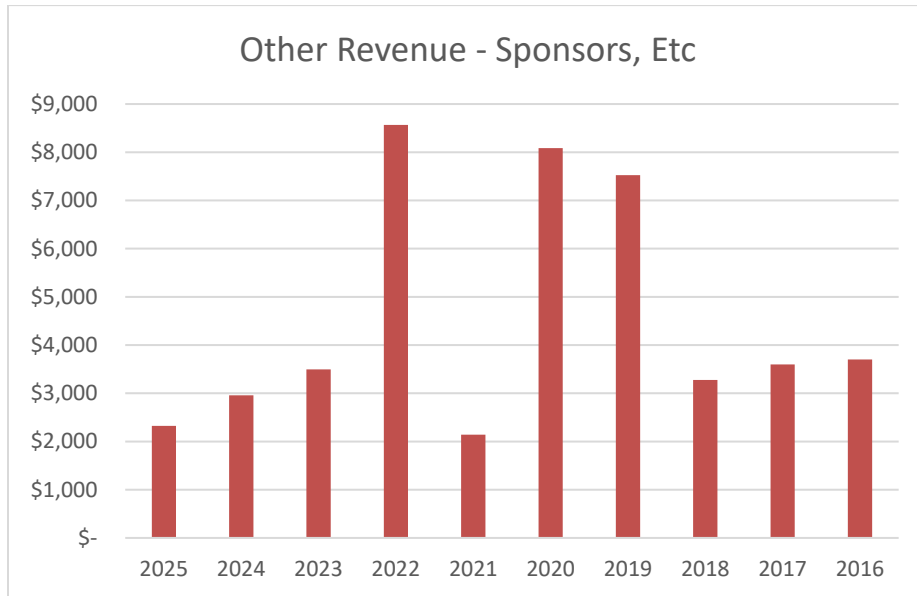
Homecoming sponsorships were down from the last several years because we got a late start on planning the homecoming date and the time needed to get and label parade prizes. We hope to rectify that this year.

We brought back the Alumni Madness bowling event in 2024 after a year off and raised enough to fully fund 1 scholarship in 2025 and 2024.

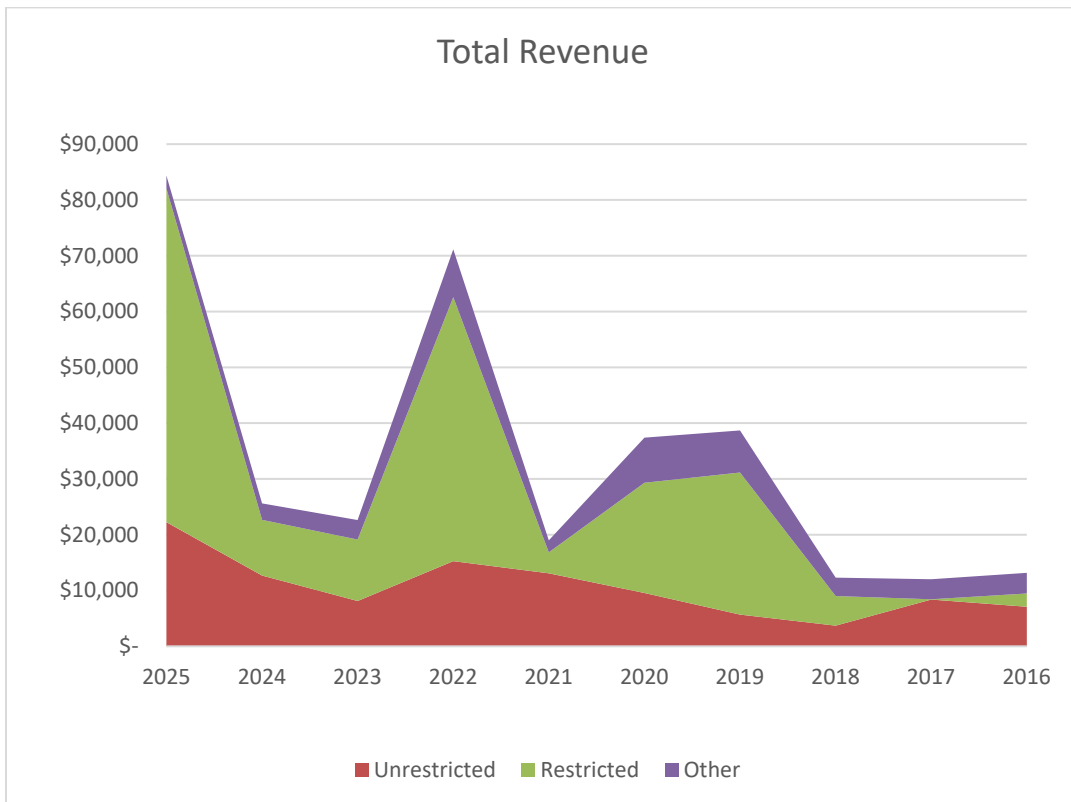
In 2024 we tried a “Tailgate Party” in conjunction with an Ohio State football game. Attendance was a bit disappointing, but those who attended had a great time. There was even a surprise appearance by the Bay Marching Band!

We continue to look for ways to get alumni together. Any suggestions are welcome.

Where the Money Goes

Expenses are separated into Program and administrative categories. Program expenses are sub categorized into scholarships, activities, and communications.

- Scholarships – From 2019 to 2024 we were able to award four \$1,000 scholarships to a graduating senior each year: Two BAF scholarships, a Class of 66 scholarship, and the Rich Voiers scholarship.
In 2025 we were able to provide eight scholarships totaling \$11,000: two \$2,500 Benevento Family; one \$1,000 Class of 1966; one \$1,000 Voiers scholarship; and four Bay Alumni Foundation \$4,000.
- Activities - Activities cover homecoming events, Senior field day, Bay Days, and other activities. In 2025 it also included \$22,500 of expenses toward naming the “Voiers Court”.
- Communication – Covers the costs of the Shoreline (alumni newsletter), Rocket Blasts, the annual report, website maintenance and other communication with alumni.
- Hall of Fame Corridor – Payments of funds collected to support the corridor project in the high school showcasing the history of Bay high and all alumni classes.
- General and Administrative – are administrative costs to run the Foundation including marketing, insurance and office supplies expenses.

Summary of Expenses

Total net expenses were up over \$21,000 from the prior year. This was due to:

- the increase in scholarships of \$7,000
- increase in activities due to the restricted payments of \$22,500 for the downpayment of naming the “Coach Voiers” court
- less the decrease in Hall of Fame corridor expenses and event expenses

Communications and general and administrative expenses were consistent from year to year.

Funded vs. Unfunded Expenses

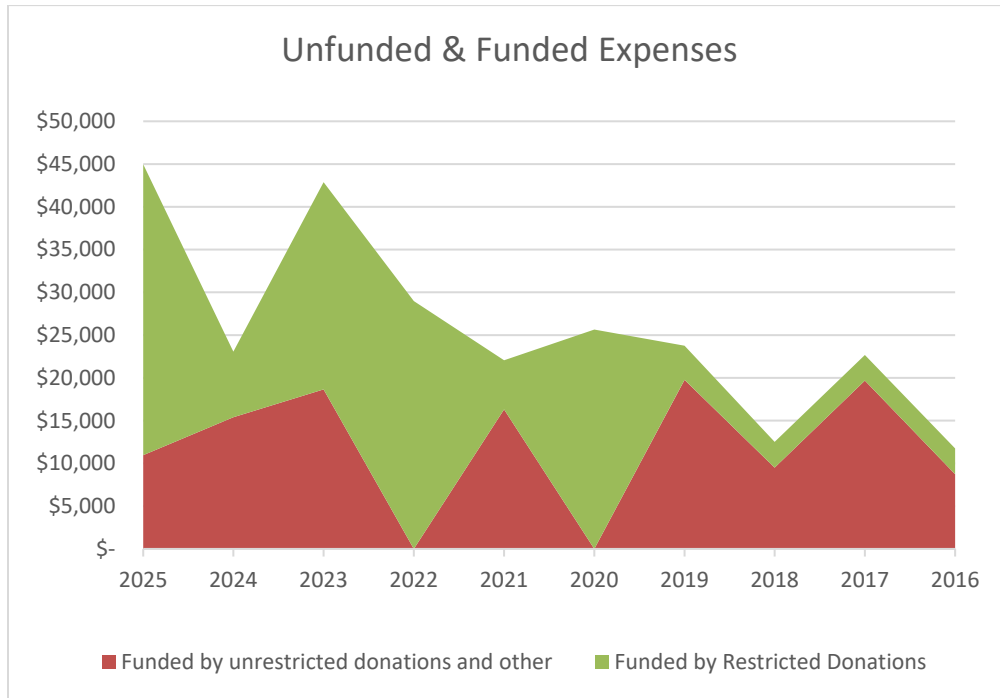
Another way of looking at expenses is to break them out between funded and unfunded expenses.

Scholarships and other major program expenses such as Hall of Fame are funded by restricted donations.

Other activities, communication and administrative costs are funded through alumni unrestricted donations and other revenue from sponsors, etc.

Recap of Profitability

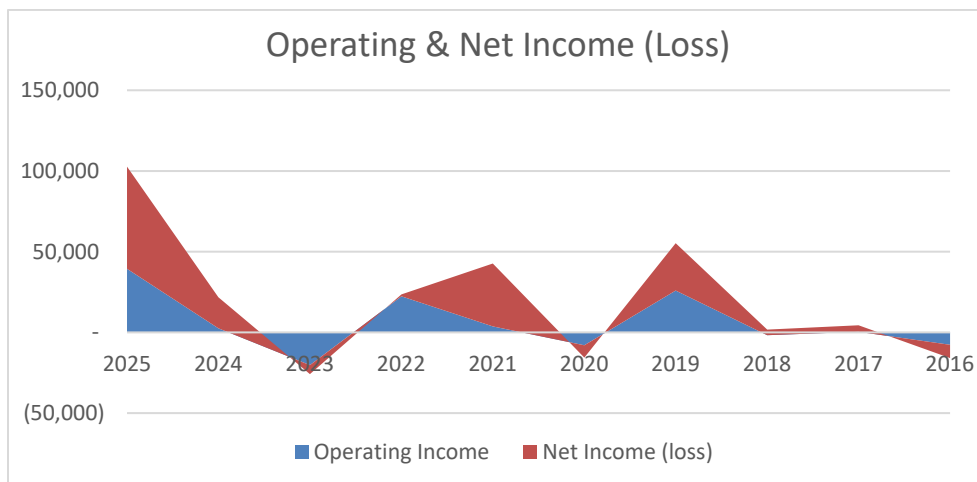
The difference between operating and net income is the investment income (loss) earned on our investments. The Board is responsible and can control operating income where investment income is dependent on the market conditions that year.

Operating profit of \$39,393 was probably the best ever due to the afore mentioned Rocket Day fund raiser and the donation for the Benevento Scholarship fund. This was an improvement from 2023 by approximately \$36,800. The bottom-line net income also improved to \$63,299; an approximate \$44,100 improvement over 2024. This was due to the improvement of operating income discussed above and better investment income by approximately \$7,200.

If you take out the effect of the purpose restricted funds which can vary year to year as the revenue is collected in one year and expenses paid in subsequent years, the unrestricted operating fund had an operating income before investment earnings of \$12,410 (2025) and \$1,451 (2024) up over approximately \$11,000 from 2024.

Statement of Financial Position (Balance Sheet)

The balance sheet is composed of your assets and liabilities. The net of those is your net assets or equity. With a not for profit, net assets are composed of net funds without donor restrictions (unrestricted) and with donor restrictions (purpose or permanent).

Unrestricted net assets can be used for any purpose related to the Foundation, but it supports the unfunded activities, communications and administrative costs.

Purpose related funds must be used for the purpose designated. Permanent endowment funds cannot be spent but the investment income earned on the funds goes to operating.

Our balance sheet is strong as you can see from the increase in total assets and unrestricted net assets as discussed below.

Unrestricted Net Assets

Our balance sheet remains strong with an increase in unrestricted net assets of \$30,708. Our cash position is good, and we have a board designated reserve that is invested with Cleveland Foundation and provides investment income.

The Foundation goal has been to reach a prudent level of unrestricted net assets to protect the Foundation and be able to undertake more events and projects. By 2025 unrestricted net assets were \$64,758 which includes the board designated fund of \$51,543 which acts as a quasi-endowment and reserve fund.

Restricted Net Assets

Scholarship Purpose Funds

The scholarship funds total \$81,150 on June 30, 2025, and are composed of:

- Class of 66 - \$28,296
- Benevento Family - \$49,111
- General BAF scholarship fund - \$3,743.

Restricted Net Assets, Continued

Project Purpose Funds

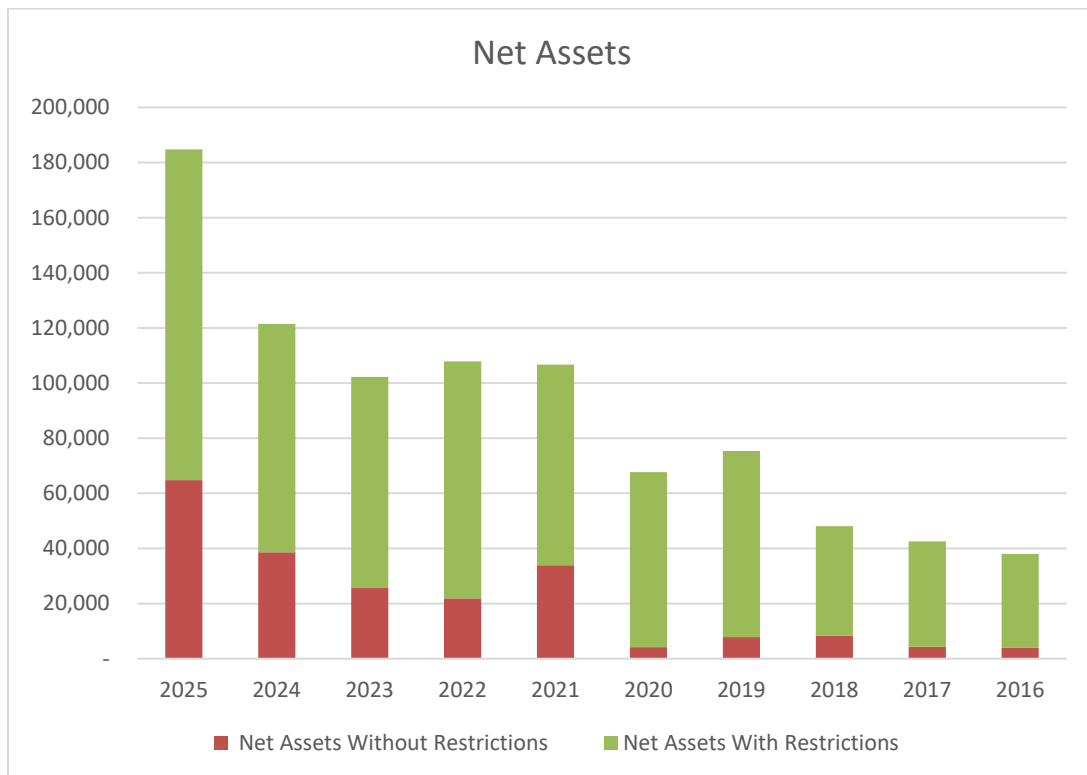
These are funds that relate to specific projects the Foundation takes on such as the Hall of Fame Corridor or Rocket Renovation (new building at the stadium). These funds will raise money for their purpose and then distribute the funds as the project commences. Eventually they will zero out but between fiscal years could have unspent contributions representing the fund balance.

These funds total \$11,115 on June 30, 2025, and are composed of the Voiers Court - \$7,999 and the Hall of Fame Corridor - -\$3,116.

Permanent Purpose Funds - Endowment

These funds have remained relatively constant since 2017 as only new donations increase the fund balance. Any investment income earned by these funds gets transferred to operations. We have not had any major campaigns to increase the endowment because we have been focused on getting the unrestricted net asset funds to a prudent level. Currently the endowment fund is at \$27,732 and invested at Cleveland Foundation in a portfolio that is geared to return 5% over inflation. If the 5% return is realized the permanent endowment only funds \$1,386 towards operating expenses. At some future point we may consider an effort to increase the endowment to a level that can contribute more to our basic operations.

INVESTMENTS HELD AT CLEVELAND FOUNDATION

Investments are held in a Cleveland Foundation investment account and co-mingled with other foundations. That investment account is recorded at fair value based on published market prices and the amounts are allocated to the investing Foundation's at net asset value. The investment objective of the fund is to earn a real return of 5% over inflation and fees measured over the majority of rolling five- and 10-year periods. The type of investments are as follows:

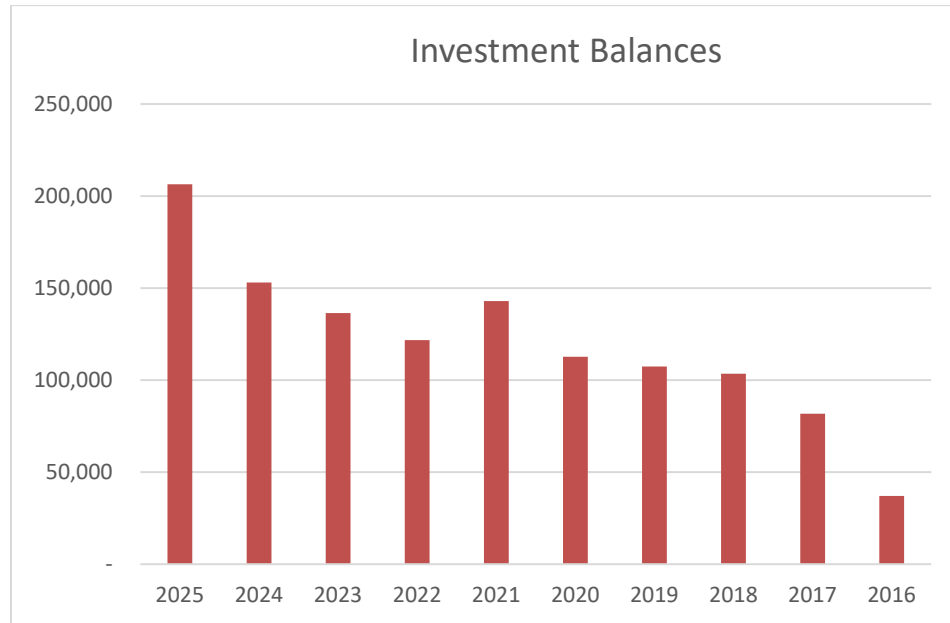

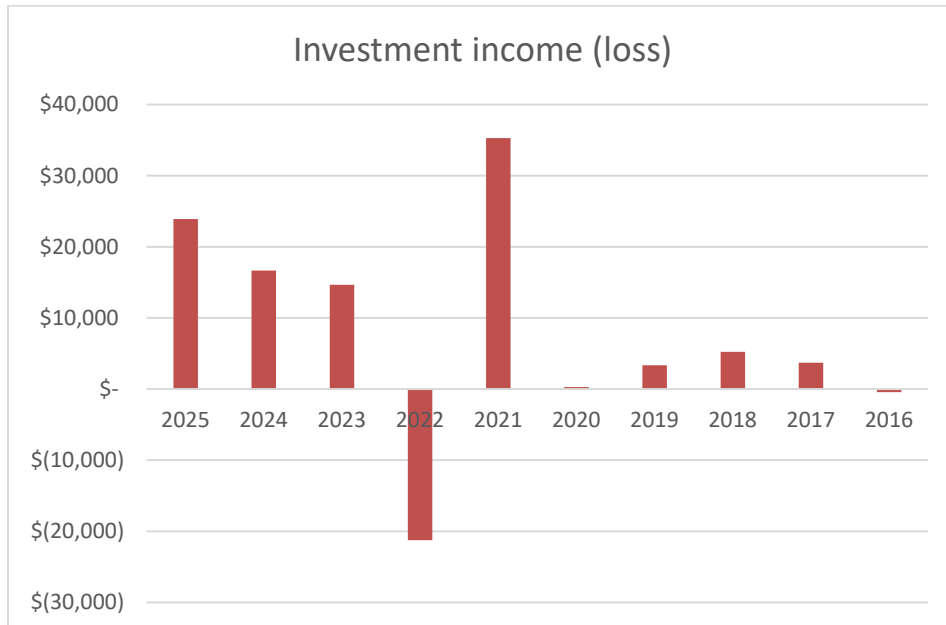

Investment Income

2025 was another good year for our investments. The Foundation investments earned \$23,906 (2025) and \$16,660 (2024) a 15.6% (2025) and 12.2% (2024) return compared to an expected 5% return of \$6,800. Our average compounded investment return was approximately 14.0% for the last 2-year; 13.3% for 3-year and 9.4% over the prior 5 years. Graph of Investment income (loss) for last 10 years:



CLASS FUNDS

The BAF acts as a trustee for Class funds for numerous classes for their future reunions and other expenses. These are funds left in their account when a class graduates or after a reunion. This is a service we provide so the class does not need to keep a bank account active. Many times, those balances are small, and bank fees add up. If after 75 years from the graduating class, the funds are not claimed they revert to the Foundation. We hold funds for classes as follows:

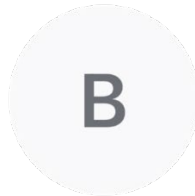
